## API Salutes Its Many Wonderful Volunteers

From the time of its founding, volunteers have been the backbone of the Alice Paul Institute. Today, volunteers are as essential as ever to fulfilling API's mission.

As API programs for the public have grown and diversified, the need for volunteers, especially tour guides, became more acute, according to Kris Myers, director of heritage and outreach. Early this year, API held the first of what would become regularly scheduled orientation programs for tour guides and other new volunteers.

"We now have a great group of tour guides. They're very enthusi-

astic and dedicated," Myers said.

Edie Camel of Westampton, a training and program development professional, and Bill Joyce of Shamong, who is retired from security work at Lockheed-Martin in Moorestown, were the first of the new tour guides to complete their training.

"They're both doing a great job," Myers said. "Bill even came to Paulsdale when snow blanketed the ground last winter to practice giving a tour."

What attracted Camel and Joyce to the Alice Paul Institute?

Camel, who grew up in the

Philadelphia area and moved back here in 2004, found the Alice Paul Institute in the *New Jersey Women's Heritage Trail* book and later read a *Philadelphia Inquirer* article about API leadership programs that mentioned the organization's need for volunteers.

"I was looking for a volunteer opportunity to get involved with the community," she said. "The Alice Paul Institute turned out to be a perfect fit for me."

Joyce, who was already a docent at Historic Smithville, was looking for additional volunteer opportunities and consulted the volunteer column in the *Courier-Post*, where he found the Alice Paul Institute.

Both Camel and Joyce were impressed with how well Myers educated them about Alice Paul and Paulsdale in preparation for

Over the summer you received a brochure inviting you to join the Alice Paul Legacy Society and support the Alice Paul Institute through planned giving. The Alice Paul Legacy Society is a group of individuals who intend to support API beyond their lifetimes through a variety of planned giving vehicles.

### **IRA Rollover Opportunity**

If you are 70 1/2 or older and have a traditional IRA from which you are required to take a manda-

tory minimum distribution, you may elect to make a direct transfer of all or a portion of that sum to the Alice Paul Institute. While the Institute benefits from the gift, you benefit by paying no federal tax on your contribution!

You may wish to consider this option if you have IRA assets that you do not need to support you in retirement. All you need to do is write a simple letter. You can obtain a form from your IRA administrator or you can contact API for a special letter of instruction that you can use to complete the gift. Please note, however, that this opportunity expires on December 31, 2007.

By investing in API's future, you will help to keep Paulsdale open to the public so that it can serve as a thriving center of leadership activity for young girls while continuing to support API's mission to develop future "Alice Pauls."

The girls chose their own name, an acronym for Girls Recognizing Alice Paul's Excellence (or Enthusiasm).

While many GRAPES members learned about Alice Paul when they visited Paulsdale on the fourth grade *Meeting Alice* field trip, Emily learned about her from her mother who worked as a nurse at the Greenleaf Nursing Home in 1977 during the last year of Paul's life.

Casey, who is in the sixth grade, expressed the sentiments of all the girls when she said, "I came to Paulsdale to learn more fun things

about Alice Paul and what she did for me."

Several GRAPES members have created school projects and research reports about Paul. Some have participated in G.O.L.D. (Girls Overnight Leadership Development) programs, and the group camped out in a tent at Paulsdale in July.

Plans for the months ahead include a tea party, hosting a *Celebrate New Jersey Women* event for other girls, reading and sharing books about powerful women and Christmas caroling at Greenleaf Nursing Home.
